PULL UP A CHAIR SEXUALITY

Scripture Reading Luke 6:41–46

FROM THE SERMON

I am suggesting that in Genesis 3 perspective, no one's sexuality is innocent. Everyone's sexuality is broken in ways known quite well to each of us in our own hearts. Everyone's sexuality needs to be morally disciplined and ordered. Meanwhile, basic standards of Christian humility direct our attention to our own issues rather than those of others.

One often hears voices in the church urging that the radical demands of Christian discipleship should not be pressed upon church members because the "loving" thing to do is to include everyone without imposing harsh demands – for example, disciplines of economic sharing or sexual fidelity. Indeed love is sometimes invoked even to sanction sexual relations outside marriage or the use of violence. Surely in such cases the term has been emptied of its meaning. The biblical story teaches us that God's love cannot be reduced to "inclusiveness": authentic love calls us to repentance, discipline, sacrifice, and transformation.
